## Wednesday Adult Religious Education begins again on January 13<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 pm

Our Wednesday Adult Religious Education series will resume on Jan. 13<sup>th</sup> with "Spirit in Practice", part two of the Tapestry of Life course "UU Spirituality" that we completed in the fall. Led by Rev. Ann Marie, anyone is invited to attend all or any part of the ten sessions that will meet every Weds through mid-March. This course is designed to help adult UU's develop regular disciplines or practices that will help us to make connection with the sacred ground of being. Whether you follow a path that could be called Humanist, Jewish, Christian, Buddhist, Pagan, Theist, Atheist, Agnostic, Mystic, or some other term or a combo platter of terms, this series offers a forum for learning, sharing, and growth that can enrich your faith journey. And, perhaps, most importantly it is an opportunity for deep sharing and for building trusting and caring relationships with each other.

In the book, Everyday Spiritual Practice, an anthology of writings by UU clergy and congregants about their spiritual practices, the Rev. Scott Alexander wrote, "In our faith every individual is expected, with the help of clergy and community, to nurture and tend the garden of his or her own religious life each and every day." This series will help us tend that garden, while we support and challenge each other along our respective paths. It will offer practical support and guidance so that spiritual growth in our personal lives and in the life of our congregation continues to blossom.
