This is a busy month for many of us as the end of the school year is now in sight and the April 15<sup>th</sup> tax deadline has been met. At UUCG it has also been a busy month because our Annual Meeting and the end of our congregational and fiscal year will both take place in the next two months. Our Pledge Campaign, which is the foundation of our budget planning for next year, is drawing to a close. Everyone's contribution is vital to our success so each member is urged to return their pledge card with their indication of support. The Nominating Committee is making their calls and contacts to ensure that we have a full slate of nominees to consider at the Annual Meeting. The Strategic Long Range Planning Committee is gathering the feedback generated by the presentation of the Draft SLRP at the Special Called Meeting. The Budget, the Board and Nominations Committee membership, and UUCG's Strategic Long Range Plan will all be considered and voted upon at our Annual Meeting which will take place after the service on Sunday, May 23<sup>rd</sup>. It is an important meeting that all UUCG Members and Friends are urged to attend.

The upcoming District Meeting, on April 30<sup>th</sup>-May 1<sup>st</sup>, will also be an important meeting as the delegates consider at least three choices for a new name for the District and elect members to the District's Board of Trustees. We will have at least three representatives at the meeting, including Reverend Ann Marie who has been nominated for a position on the District Board. UUCG is entitled to two delegates based on our membership numbers. At the April Board Meeting Patrice Alexander and Judi Hickson were appointed as delegates with Tom Thielen as the alternate.

The next two months are not just all about meetings and serious issues. They are also about fun, fellowship, and making plans for the summer. We will be sponsoring another McAllister's Commu-

# Reflections

. . . of Rev Ann Marie Alderman

Later this month, on Sunday, May 23, members of UUCG will gather for the annual congregational meeting. Members will have the opportunity to vote on the proposed 2010/11 budget, new board members, and the Strategic Long Range Plan. It has long been a hallmark of our way of making congregational decisions for every member to have an equal voice, by the means of voting, to decide together what our particular purpose is and how we will keep moving toward fulfilling that purpose. The annual meeting is particularly reflective of our 5th principle which says in part that we affirm and promote; “The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations...”

Sometimes, many of us think, “ho hum” it’s just business, let those who care about the details do whatever they think is best! I appreciate and respect that part of this attitude comes from a sense of trust, a reliance on the current leaders and their process, respecting that they are deeply familiar with the details, and have fleshed out the varying perspectives and are presenting what they have come to think of as the best conclusion. Open to questions, in the end “they” are asking the congregation to endorse their process.

Trusting leaders and their process is a good thing! Yet, there is also the matter of owning the conclusions!

The most important part of annual congregational meeting, in my view, is when the

“I trust them”, becomes the “we” who have decided together! What I mean is; there is a deeply religious significance in our way of governing ourselves. We elect leaders, who we entrust for a time, to process through the details, to arrive at proposals, then each of us as individuals are invited to assess the proposals and to freely express our conscience and may suggest changes or amendments. Yet, when a final vote is taken on whatever is before the congregation that is when WE become more than individuals! We have said together who we are and what we will do.

It is in that moment after a vote, when we have the opportunity to most sense what and to whom we belong, what we together own and what we are owned by, when our individuality is transcended becoming the interdependent whole to which we belong, that makes meaning and moves together. In my view, that’s the essence of our way of being a congregation! It is not just business, it is theology... it is meaning making, belonging and “ownership” in the deepest sense!
