Developmental Minister Search

The DMTF - Developmental Minister Task Force has met twice with a third meeting scheduled for July 30. The purpose of DMTF is to define the KSA's (knowledge, skills, abilities) UUCG needs in a developmental minister to move the congregation forward while retaining our basic identity and philosophy.

A series of 5 Cottage Meetings are scheduled and will be announced to the congregation beginning July 21st. Each congregant is encouraged to sign up for one (1) of the Meetings to socialize with other members but more importantly to express their opinions and desires for UUCG's forward path.


